





to Restore Detroit's Historic Fort Wayne as a National Park

Michigan senator Stephanie Chang is sponsoring this petition to have Detroit's Fort Wayne designated a National Park. She and petition signers also call for revitalization and restoration of this important military installation, citing its historic importance, not only to Michigan, but also to the nation. The fort saw the opening shots of the War of 1812, and was the signing place of the end-of-war treaty between the American government and Native American tribes that fought for the British; it has relevance, also, to the River Raisin battles fought in 1813. As the location of the Tuskegee Airmen Museum, it stands as a memorial to World War II black American veterans; it has significance as a Civil War mustering into service site, as well as serving as an important WWI and WWII storage depot and transportation hub.

A Federal bill approved by Congress in 2009 already provides for secure funding for site revitalization and maintenance under the national park system, IF the city of Detroit donates the land for said national park. With the construction of the Gordie Howe International Bridge in progress, the time is now optimal to do so, and thereby take advantage of this rich source of economic, and historical benefits to Detroit and to Michigan.

March 19 - Michigan's G.A.R. Museum Showcases "Andersonville"



Michigan's Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.) Memorial Hall and Museum in Eaton Rapids will be sponsoring a Free Civil War History Seminar on Tuesday, March 19, 2019, at 7:00 PM at Michigan's G.A.R.

Memorial Hall & Museum located at 224 South Main Street in Eaton Rapids. The topic of the presentation is entitled Andersonville The presenter will be Bruce B. Butgereit.

At the May 30, 1904 dedication of the Andersonville Prison Michigan monument, General James H. Kidd, 6th Michigan Cavalry, declared, "It is a far cry from Michigan to Georgia, but Michigan will not forget or cease to honor the men who filled the ranks of her volunteers...". One-hundred years later, at the rededication of the newly restored Michigan monument on May 30, 2004, a contingent of residents of Michigan proved General Kidd's words were true.

The presentation will begin with a video documentary of the prison by Mr. Kevin Frye, long-time historian of Andersonville Prison. A powerpoint presentation by Mr. Butgereit will follow, highlighting the rededication ceremony and other events from the May 30, 2004 weekend.

Bruce Butgereit is a former commander of the Michigan Commandery of the Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States and Michigan Department of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War has coordinated restoration efforts for many Civil War memorials and conducted countless ceremonies to dedicate and/or rededicate headstones for Civil War soldiers. Bruce is a professional historical researcher, preservation consultant, genealogist, public speaker, and historian. He has received numerous awards for his historical work. He has coordinated the restoration of 14 Civil War memorials, including the Michigan monument at Andersonville. Bruce currently serves as the Executive Director of History Remembered, Inc., a not for profit organization dedicated to promoting historic preservation and restoration through educational programs.
