

December 31th Update: MAJOR STEP FORWARD!

The board of the Michigan Civil War Association is pleased announce that Michael Kraus' proposal was chosen to design, sculpt and oversee the Michigan Monument at Antietam – a monument creation dedicated to all Michigan men who served and sacrificed at the Battle of Antietam.

Kraus is an artist, material culture expert and historian from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Since 1993, he has created over 20 major works of sculpture, including many featuring the Civil War era. In the mean time, he has also served as a curator, author, and historian. Additionally, Mr. Kraus already has a relationship with the Antietam National Battlefield. He has previously been commissioned by them to repair several monuments on site that had been damaged.

The board feels Mr. Kraus brings a wide range of expertise, from the artistic and technical of sculpting to the artistry of detail, to the passion for an history which make him our choice to partner with through the monument creation process.

The MCWA board will be working with Mr. Kraus over the next several months in launching the first phase of the project in the creation of a maquette (a specific type of model used in the sculpting process) for use in fundraising and awareness. We are excited to introduce Michael Kraus to you today and look forward to moving forward to the next steps in fundraising for the Michigan Monument at Antietam!
