




Dearest Don and Julie,

Civil War Discovery Camp: Tuesday, August 9, 2022 9AM - 3PM


Michigan's Grand Army of the Republic Memorial Hall and Museum

Hosted by the G.A.R. Museum located in Eaton Rapids. The camp is open to children between 7 and 14 years of age. The students will be taken to G.A.R. Island Park for several hours of planned activities to include instruction of manual of arms, how to march,

history of the G.A.R. Island Park, information about the life of a Civil War soldier, how to fire a reproduction Civil War musket (with prior parental/guardian approved), etc. This will be followed by a tour of the G.A.R. 
