Quartermaster's Report Don Everett, Quartermaster

Use to supply chain and shipping problems the powder and cap delivery was delayed and not received until Dec. 11th. We have received a 2 year supply of powder and caps made up of Schuetzen powder, musket caps and pistol caps. Our new cap supply consists of Schuetzen and RWS musket caps and RWS pistol caps. Schuetzen musket caps come in

tins of 100 and the cost for them is \$9 per tin. RWS musket caps come in tins of 200 and the cost for them is \$19 per tin.We also have some no 1075 (no 11) RWS pistol caps. RWS no 1075 caps come 250 to a tin and cost \$20 per tin. RWS no1075 pistol caps (no 11) are slightly smaller than CCI or Remington no11 caps. For those of you that are close to a Sport's Warehouse location, they have CCI 4 wing caps available at reasonable prices. When our current supply of powder is exhausted the new price will be \$21 per pound of powder. I apologize for the fluctuating prices in past newsletters but until I had the actual invoice before me I was not able to correctly calculate the new price.

DON'T PANIC BUY POWDER!!!!!! There are reports of people asking \$100 a pound for black powder on line and at events. Anything over \$30 a pound is price gouging. Some dealers are out of black powder and do not know when they are going to have any. They may try to sell you Pyrodex or Triple 7. DON'T BUY THEM. Black powder is still available at retail price. Swiss and Schuetzen powder is still being manufactured and imported! BEWARE there are dealers that may tell you that you can use Pyrodex or Triple 7 for blanks. Don't buy Pyrodex or Triple 7 powders for blanks. They are chemical propellants (smokeless powder) not black powder (explosive). They will not work for blanks as they must be contained to burn properly (go bang). Both Pyrodex and Triple 7 require that they are topped with a bullet for the powder to burn properly. Only use black powder substitutes for live shooting, NOT FOR BLANKS!

7th Michigan to Salute Michigan's Battle Flags: Saturday, January 22

Members will gather together on Saturday, Jan. 22 for a viewing of some of Michigan's original civil war battle flags. Matt VanAcker, the coordinator for the "Save the Flags" project of the state, will be showing some of the original battle flags flown by Michigan troops during the civil war.

Club members who are interested will gather for breakfast ahead of time at the Flap Jack Shack, 3000 E. Grand River in Lansing (just north of Frandor) at 8:30am. Everyone will then meet at 11am for the viewing at the Michigan Historical Center, 702 E. Kalamazoo in Lansing (just west of the Capitol).

The Save the Flags project began in 1989 with the restoration of the Capitol building. There are over 150 flags in the collection, most of them from the civil war. All of them are being preserved, and are on display (on a limited basis) at the Michigan Historical Center.

At this flag viewing you will learn of the most recent developments in the Save the Flags project. You will also get to see some of the original battle flags and hear their stories.



Remember we are only as strong as those who show up. Please make every attempt to attend events. We are strong, growing and healthy!




