

Annual Harvest Ball Report: This year's participants numbered between 65-75. For the second year in a row, the club did NOT make a profit. A raise in ticket price of \$5-10 is being considered. Gilbert & Cyndi Carlson are proposing to move the ball to a less busy time of year-perhaps February, or early spring. 
