Deadline date for submissions is the 25<sup>th</sup> of each month. Please have all reports, articles, notices, etc. in print-ready form.



As most of you know by now, Jim MacKinnon suffered a stroke at the beginning of October. He is currently recovering in the hospital. Cards or flowers can be sent to him at:

Club members who have visited say Jim is recovering slowly, but steadily.

Oct. 8 - Jim Kirschensteiner: - "I visited with Jim MacKinnon this morning. He said he feels OK, but his left side "went to sleep". He can't feel anything on the left side. He does get a twitch from time to time on in his left thumb and left leg. The stroke seems to be localized. His mouth doesn't droop at all on the left side. His speech is slow and a little garbled, but mental functions are OK. They had to put a pace maker in for his heart. He said when they went to take him to therapy the first time, he passed out before going and that's when they put the pace maker in. I asked if they knew what caused the stroke and he said it was like

high blood pressure. (the silent killer) He doesn't know how long he'll be in the hospital. He's bummed that he can't go to the Mill Spring event, but seems in good spirits... Jim's sister, Kathy was with him today." Steve Church reported on Oct. 14 that Jim was moved to the rehab floor in Neumann wing at Sparrow, "doing PT,


Next year's date will be October 10, 2020 so mark it on your calendars now.

Jean was an alumna of Western Michigan University with a BA in mathematics. She was a member of the NRA, and Chief Okemos Sportsman's Club.

Joan (& Tom) Emerick said there was representation from 7 different bands that Jean played with, including the 7<sup>th</sup>'s former Fifes & Drums. #### Military Report:

Captain Doug McComas presented a resolution which he wishes to submit to the Cumber-land Guard leadership, requesting that the 7<sup>th</sup> MI Vol. Inf., Co. B be reinstated as members of the Guard. Under the command of Col. Rob Van (who assumed that position upon the retirement of Col. Dave Shakelford), much positive change has occurred during the 6 years since the



7<sup>th</sup> left that organization. Rob is also now also stepping down as colonel, to be replaced by Nick Miner.

The resolution (see it on the next page) was voted on and passed by the membership. Doug said that it should be noted that it was a unanimous decision by club members to leave the Cumberland Guard 6 years ago, and today the quorum present at the Annual Meeting voted unanimously to submit the resolution for rejoining the Guard. It is stipulated that we would also still remain as members of the Great Lakes Battalion.

#### Meridian Village: New Opportunity

Civilian coordinator, Sue Colegrove discussed with the club a significant meeting she and President Dave Downing attended with the leadership of Historic Meridian Village, in Okemos. Attached is our October Newsletter as compiled by our editor, James B. Pahl. (NOTE: See Separate PDF)


Among the material included is information on our two upcoming programs in October and a synopsis with pictures of our Kids' Civil War Discovery Camp Program in August.

It's fascinating to see what the technological revolution can bring us now. The Library of Congress online catalog features a "Thanksgiving Day—Songs and music" subject heading that you can browse for both printed scores and sound recordings. Two of the older (1860's!) music printings piqued my interest. First, there's Rev. W.M. Hubbard's "New National Thanksgiving Hymn," registered for copyright in the District Court for the District of Massachusetts in 1863 shortly after President Lincoln's proclamation recommending a general day of thanksgiving on Nov. 26, thus ushering in our national Thanksgiving holiday, Then there is "Give Thanks, all ye People: A National Hymn", also known as The "President's Hymn", composed by William Augustus Muhlenberg with music by Joseph W. Turner also to commemorate Lincoln's Proclamation. It became a popular hymn and was published in several Church Hymnals. It's confusing, though, since there is also a "Thanksgiving Hymn", by Muhlenberg, that seems to have the same words as the President's Hymn, but lists James B. Taylor as co-composer. So is it the same song or not? Hmmm.

Nonetheless, the person to really be credited with creating a national Thanksgiving Day is Sarah Hale. We know her as the author of the poem "Mary Had a Little Lamb" but she was much more. By the time of the Civil War she was quite an old lady, but for decades she had petitioned every U.S. President requesting the establishment of a national day of Thanksgiving. To God. Abraham Lincoln was the first to grant her request. An ardent abolitionist, she also used her influence as editor of two women's magazines to advocate for the end of slavery. Quite a lady. ---The Editor
