Skating, anyone?

Linda Williams sent in this report on her research so far in seeking a possible site for an ice skating party later on in the winter:

Ingham County, including Lansing, has no outdoor ice rinks - only the rink at Michigan State University - an indoor rink. We really should have an outdoor rink to be as authentic as possible. We could use the Hawk Island pond, but we have to get three million dollars in insurance. The pond is a gravel pit which could have unsafe ice, and it has deep water below; we'd use it at our own risk.

Grand Rapids has a beautiful ice rink right downtown in front of the art museum - akin to Rockefeller Center in New York City. I don't know if the club members would want to drive that far for an hour on the ice (I'd have to find out if they will rent for an hour of exclusive use.) The advantage is that the ice is outside and maintained. If someone has (or knows someone who has) a pond on their property, we could possibly use that, but it would need snow shoveled and the ice would be bumpy. Remember the old days!

I don't know if other cities have similar outdoor rinks with maintained ice, and again, we'd have to consider the drive. I'd like to schedule something for this winter. If that isn't possible, we can consider it for next winter.

When we did this before, the public was invited to watch - again another facet of our teaching people about what people did in the 1860's. Someone's pond may be inaccessible due to spectators having to go through deep snow to the ice, then having nowhere to sit.

From looking at options, I think Grand Rapids is the best location. I'll first need input from reenactors, then I'll need to see if they would allow us an hour for just us to be on the ice... a "living Christmas card" as a gift to Grand Rapids. We could invite the Grand Rapids based 3rd Michigan to join us!

December 2013 Civil War Sesquicentennial Report

The November 9, 2013 annual Michigan Reenactors' Conference was a great success. Fifty plus participants attended and updates were provided by the Michigan Historical Commission, the Michigan Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission, and the Michigan Civil War Sesquicentennial History Partners. A total of 173 events were listed for 2013 (180 in 2012 and 163 in 2011). After the Michigan Sesquicentennial updates, upcoming Michigan events and events of interest to Michigan for 2014 were presented by the conference participants. Currently 62 events already have been listed on the state-wide reenactor calendar for 2014!
