

The following is a summary of information of interest received by Tom Emerick from historian Brian Egen, of The Henry Ford:

A non-profit group (Michigan CW Association—of which Brian is a founding member) has been formed and in cooperation with the Michigan HIstorical Society has purchased an easement on property adjacent to the Antietam Battlefield with the intention of erecting a monument to Michigan units which fought there. The location of the 20 by 20 foot easement is where the 7th Michigan crossed the Hagerstown Pike/Dunker Church Road right where the West Woods juts westerly before jutting north again. More information will be forthcoming after the first of the new year about costs, fundraising, and so on. The 7th MI has been invited to participate in raising awareness of the project and hopefully to contribute monetarily.

Dear Friends of the 24th Michigan Volunteer Infantry,

This past Saturday, the 24<sup>th</sup> Michigan added the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Lincoln's funeral to its calendar for 2015. This event will be in Springfield, IL on the first weekend in May, specifically May 2 & 3, 2015. The event will include two parades. The first on Saturday is about 1 mile and will accompany a hearse from the train station to the Old Capitol. There will also be some ceremonial activities to mark the occasion. I should add that a replica of the original train will be pulling to the station containing the casket. On Sunday, the parade will be from the Old Capitol to the crypt and will be about 3 miles long. You can find details about the event at lincolnfuneralcoalition.org

The original 24<sup>th</sup> Michigan was stationed at Springfield at the end of the war and participated as part of the honor guard for Lincoln's funeral. I can't think of a better way to end this cycle of 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary events! I would like your organization to consider joining us for this event. For that matter, we are such a small unit anymore, we can join you! However, wouldn't it be cool to go as the 24<sup>th</sup> Michigan who were actually there?

This will be a dress uniform event – shine your brass and wear white gloves. Hardee hats and frocks coats would be preferred, but actually, many of the original Iron Brigade members wore sack coats. There will be no firing by infantry, so no ammo. There will be a military camp, and authentic civilian camp and a mixed camp. It is about 6 ½ hours from Toledo. Ohio to Springfield so not too bad of a ride.

Registration is on line and is by the individual. Cost is \$20.

I strongly urge you to join the 24th for this event. I am even putting on the blue suit and carrying my rifle! Please let me know if you decided to join us so the unit can make some appropriate planning.

An illustrious chapter in the history of the Jackson community and American Civil War reenacting has come to an end.

At the request of the board of Cascades, Inc., after a run of thirty years the Seventh Michigan Volunteer Infantry, Company B re-enacting club will no longer co-host the Cascades Civil War Muster at Cascades Park. Three decades ago a dedicated group of Civil War enthusiasts, in cooperation with the Jackson County Parks and Cascades, Inc., organized what grew into the largest annual Civil War re-enactment in the Midwest.

Each August thousands of re-enactors from around the United States, Canada and Europe journeyed to Jackson to display a wide variety of period military and civilian impressions, educating the public about the War Between the States and honoring our forebears' patriotism and sacrifices. Over a two-day period tens of thousands of spectators descended upon Cascades Park to take in the sights and smells of mid-Nineteenth Century life, coming away with a greater appreciation of a crucial period in the nation's history.

The Seventh Michigan is proud and honored to have contributed to establishing the Cascades Civil War Muster and making it a resounding success. Our heartfelt thanks go out to the Jackson community, event sponsors, re-enactors, sutlers and the Boy Scouts of America for their unwavering support.
