

May all of you and your families experience a peaceful and joyous holidays. I'm looking forward to the 2016 Campaign Season!




Highlights from Nov. 15 Club Meeting:

Doug McComas is in charge of the AED. The AED will go to all Maximum Events and be housed in the Captains tent in a bag with a RED CROSS.



FINAL Sesquicentennial Events Report

Of the 150 Sesquicentennial events listed on the Reenactors' Civil War Sesquicentennial Calendar for 2015 on the Michigan Civil War Sesquicentennial History Partners' website (www.micw150.us), 3 were reported for December. During the five years of Civil War Sesquicentennial, 812 Michigan events and events of interest to Michigan were posted.

Since 2015 ended the Civil War Sesquicentennial commemoration and, technically, the existence of the 7th's Sesquicentennial Committee, this month's listing will be the last one for the Civil War Sesquicentennial. It has been pleasure serving on 7th's Sesquicentennial Committee and helping to keep the membership informed of the various Civil War Sesquicentennial events for the last five year.

Although the Sesquicentennial Event listings have ended, the Reenactors' Civil War Calendar itself will continue, albeit no longer as a calendar of *Sesquicentennial* events. The new Reenactors' Civil War Calendar of Events for 2016 already has been posted. Thus far, 73 events have been posted.
