

2012 Military Activities

February 11 - Officers and NCO School of Instruction – Leslie, MI

Tom Emerick reported approximately 30 men from various units participated in the drill despite of the poor driving conditions from prior night's snow storm. Representatives from the 1st US Sharpshooters, Co. B, 3rd Michigan, 7th Michigan, 15th Michigan, 21st Michigan, 23rd Michigan, 24th Michigan, and 26th Michigan fell in for a full day of drill. I do hope I didn't miss anyone. The 3rd Michigan (again) was the winner of the free lunch. Along with the maneuvers (Tom kept emphasizing "Where is the guide?") we reviewed Dress Parade, basic guard mount, and ½ hour dedicated to Skirmish Drill conducted by Jim MacKinnon. We just plain ran out of time to cover everything. A good time was had by all and we are looking forward to greater numbers at the March drill.

March 10 - Company and Battalion Drill School of Instruction - Leslie, MI

We will be looking to exploit the lessons learned in the February 11th drill and cover even more territory. The 7th Michigan Volunteer Infantry, Co. B will be hosting a seven-hour infantry drill session from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on **March 10**th at the White Pine Academy. The school will be open an hour in advance so drills can begin

promptly at 9:00. Lessons will cover basic maneuvers and formations taken from Casey's School of the Soldier, School of the Company, School of the Battalion, up to and including some Brigade-level evolutions. Instruction will concentrate on positioning and movements of Corporals, Sergeants, up through Field Officers within the various evolutions. In addition to basic maneuvers, we will cover Inspection Arms, Color Company and Color Guard, etc. There will be a demonstration of School of the Sword, if Officers are interested, to rehearse the positions utilized during Dress Parade. Mark Heath will be incorporating bugle signals into our movements throughout the day. Brother units or individuals from throughout the state (or out-of-state) are invited to attend. All ranks are invited to participate from privates up through Officers. If you plan to bring younger recruits (too young to serve in the ranks) I will be more than happy to employ them as markers.

All attendees should wear the uniform with their current rank, bring their rifle or sword, accoutrements, and **soft-soled shoes**. Modern athletic shoes are permitted and encouraged as we will be drilling inside a gymnasium on tile floors. Please no heel plates. Leave all ammunition at home.

I am reserving a room for at the local Crossroads Restaurant for our noontime meal. This is to take advantage of the restaurant's large room to share camaraderie and partake of our afternoon meal en masse. There also is a MacDonald's within a mile of the school. For brown-baggers there are cafeteria tables and a small kitchenette at the school. There will be coffee and light baked goods at the school in the morning before drill commences.

I plan to prepare a spreadsheet listing the movements to be reviewed and the sections of Casey's from which they are taken. I will distribute this document in electronic format in advance of the drill date for those who want to familiarize themselves with the particulars. Notify me if you want a copy sent to you.

The White Pine Academy address is 510 Russell Street, Leslie, MI 49251. It is located 4/10 of a mile south of downtown Leslie. Take US-127 to exit 56, go east to the first stoplight, go through stoplight 5/10 of mile and turn right (south) onto Russell St. The Mill St. stop sign is 3/10 of a mile south on Russell. The school is 1/10 of a mile past Mill St. on west side of the road.

Brigading:

We will be falling in with our comrades-in-arms from the 3rd Michigan, Co. F who are sending a dozen men to fight the rebels. Steve Gelfius (an old, old time 7th Michigan member) from the 30th Indians is joining our merry band. Rumor has it a few stout fellows from the Black Hat Battalion will also be fighting along side us in the

Union ranks. Headquarters will use our registered numbers to determine whether we fight as a single company or are combined to serve under another unit commander. Be sure to get your registration in as soon as you know you will be going.

Registration:

Opens on Thursday at 7:00 a.m. It sounds like registration will be closed during the night Thursday and Friday nights. You can set-up no matter what time you arrive. You are permitted to drive up to your encampment to unload.

Supplies:

The event hosts assure me we will be in the thick of the fighting all weekend long. They recommended bringing upwards of 300 rounds but a more realistic amount would be 200 rounds. Our company cooks are not making the trip down so everybody will need to bring their own rations.

Tentage:

We are portraying an early war impression (1862). They are encouraging us to bring most any type of tentage (wedge, shelter half, sibley, etc.) for the company streets but want to restrict the use wall tents to Company officers and above.

Uniforms:

We are portraying an early war impression (1862). We should be ok with anything we wear. A safe bet is to bring your fatigue blouse if you have one.

Carpooling:

Tom has sent out email notices requesting information on who wants to carpool/departure/return dates/etc. If you are willing to drive please let Tom know so we do not leave anyone behind.

May 27 - Monroe Civil War Monument Dedication - Monroe, MI

This will be a dedication ceremony for a monument honoring over 400 Monroe County soldiers who died during the Civil War. We should plan to arrive about 10:00 to ensure we have a close parking spot. The actual ceremony commences at 2:00 P.M. and is being held at the Soldiers and Sailors Park located at the corner of East Front and Navarre Streets in Monroe, Michigan. There will be a Civil War Living History encampment onsite next to the Sawyer House from Noon to 4:00 P.M. for those who want to pitch tents and/or drill. Confirmed participants to date include 7th Michigan Infantry, Co. B, 15th Michigan Infantry, Co. B, an artillery battery representing the 1st Michigan Light Artillery Battery H "DeGoylers, 5th Michigan Regimental Band, Fred Priebe portraying President Abraham Lincoln, and Steve Alexander portraying General George Custer. The 7th Michigan is committed to supporting the Greenfield Village Memorial weekend event. We have received permission from the hosts and Union headquarters to leave the Village grounds to participate in the Monroe ceremony. There will be numerous Union and Confederate units encamped on the battlefield throughout the weekend. Subject: Swedes in Antietam 2012

Dear Sir,

Here is a short report from the Regiment's northern outpost. Despite the cold weather and snow we try to keep our company in shape. During 2011 we participated in at least 2 battles and the company performed well. In February/ March we will stay in our club house for a week. There is a winter holiday from school then, and there is a lot of small cowboys and Indians visiting us that week. And in May we will probably host another battle from the civil war.

Last year me and Björn was at Waterloo and fought with the British 95th rifles. I realized that caps have an advantage against flintlock. They rarely misfire. It was a very good event and we had fun.

I follow the news from 7th and am very impressed at the work you put into the regiment. Is there any weekends at all you are free ??? When we visited you 2004 we traveled by car from Michigan and ended up in New York. We were at the battlefield of Antietam, and even though Gettysburg is fantastic Antietam seems more authentic and well preserved. I read that you were going to Shiloh this year and also to Antietam.

I now wonder if it would at all be possible for some Swedish privates to join your ranks in Antietam 2012? I read that we would fight with the Iron brigade, and we would of course join in the right uniform. We arrange with our own transport and so forth, but if possibly would need to borrow rifles from you. (I will investigate the possibility to bring our own, but I suspect that it will be expensive and difficult).

I've not put out any invitation with the company yet, as I would need to know from you that it is ok for us to join you as we did in Gettysburg 2008. We could of course come over and see the event as audience, but would prefer to sleep on the soil and have the opportunity to meet the death of a hero on the fields of glory with our comrades in company B.

My intention, if it also is ok with you, is to attend the 150th battle in Gettysburg 2013.

I'm not entirely sure that my beloved wife's intentions and my own correspond about Antietam and Gettysburg, but I put my hope that love will prevail and overcome small obstacles like war on foreign soil.

Photos above, and at left, taken in southern Sweden in 2011, at a reenactment of the 1862 Battle of Hartsville. The scenario pictured was Union forces in camp, suddenly coming under attack by Confederates. Following both infantry and cavalry charges, they were supposed to surrender after a heavy bombardment by artillery. Patrik explains further: "I also attach a picture of Private Arne (he visited you along with the rest of us in 2004). He was so into the role of an attacked, unprepared Union soldier, that he didn't even get into his uniform (Be aware, ladies!!!)." The burning tents at left "were fake, made by white plastic. But from a distance they were ok." Yes, indeed!

Patrick,

It is good to hear you are doing well and still excited about the hobby. I will try to answer your questions as best as I can.

First, would you mind if we published your letter in the Club newsletter in order to share it with all of our Club members?

Is there any weekends at all you are free ???

My wife would say absolutely not. Re-enacting is my one fault and I do it way too much.



I now wonder if it would at all be possible for some Swedish privates to join your ranks in Antietam 2012?

First, let me explain the event details. This is not a national-level event with thousands of participants and big battles like the 145th Gettysburg was. It is a smaller living history program where we (the Union troops) are camped on the "real" Antietam NPS Battlefield. The 7th Michigan, and all of the other participating units, are interested in attending because we get to sleep, eat, and fire our weapons on the actual battlefield our ancestors (to include the original 7th Michigan) fought on 150 years ago. Two years ago we camped next to the Dunker Church but might be bivouacking in another location this year. There were 100+ troops present at the 2010 program. We portray camp life, interact with the public, and put on a few firing demonstrations both Saturday and Sunday. We have extra time to wander about the battlefield and visit the museum right across the street.... We would be honored for you and your comrades to fall in with us. We will provide you with rifles, accoutrements, camp equipage, etc. if you come over. As part of your uniform, you will need to provide your own Hardee hats as we don't have extra ones to loan out. It is the one clothing item the hosts are insisting on.

My intention, if it also is ok with you, is to attend the 150th battle in Gettysburg 2013.

Patrik, we have been anxiously looking forward to your return visit for the big battle in 2013. It will be the largest national-level event of the 150th anniversary cycle and will probably exceed the numbers you saw in 2008. We will, again, provide you with rifles, accoutrements, camp equipage, etc. if you come over. You will have to promise to teach us how to speak Danish before we step on the battlefield this time though.

Please feel free to contact me should you need any additional information.


Tee shirts-- we have the following 7th Michigan clothing for sale:




