



# Military Minutes - October 2013

Our first meeting of the fall started with our normal social time at 1:00 pm, with the Military meeting starting at 1:30 pm. During the social time we all looked over the items available for sale from the 7th Michigan sutlery. Thanks to Don Everett for buying, pricing, storing, transporting items to our meetings, and transacting sales. We all appreciate that effort, and having the chance to get reasonably priced accounterments. The meeting itself covered the following topics:

#### 2013 Jackson Cascades Muster Review

The consensus was that the Muster went well, with a minimum of the normal challenges to deal with during such a large event. The weather cooperated again, for which we are all thankful. The battle scenarios were well received and enjoyed by the participants as far as we have heard. A couple of things we plan to work on is making sure the public has good viewing areas, and to have the infantry work with the artillery more closely to take casualties when a cannon fires directly at them, as worked out beforehand. We agreed that Tom Emerick did a great job as overall Union commander, as did the staff that served under him.

We also are very appreciative of other Units that support Jackson as co-hosts or participate in the event. With everyone doing what they can, it makes the event memorable and worthwhile.

#### • 2014 Jackson Cascades Muster

Tom Emerick is looking for ideas on 150th anniversary battles to portray, and everyone is encouraged to send him ideas. It is also the 30th anniversary of the Jackson Muster, and we want to find creative ways to celebrate that. We reviewed what is going on with the organizations that we work with (Parks administration, Cascades Inc, etc) to make sure things go smoothly as possible again in 2014.

#### 2014 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary National Events

As of the meeting, Tom Emerick reported on three possible events he was aware of. We will keep looking for events and decide early in 2014 which ones we may want to go to.

- May 1-4, Wilderness & Spottsylvania Courthouse (Virginia)
- September 19-21, Battle of Atlanta (Georgia)
- November 15-16, Battle of Franklin (Tennessee)

#### 2014 Company Drill Sessions

Discussion was had regarding whether the 7<sup>th</sup> should host a drill session again in the spring, but no decision was made. The 4<sup>th</sup> Michigan Infantry (Captain Russ Paul) has invited the 7<sup>th</sup> Michigan to attend their Winter Camp (Camp McGregor, Clarklake, MI) for training.

#### Mid-Western Umbrella Organizations

The military members discussed the merits of joining other organizations. The 7th Michigan has been associated with the Black Hat Battalion for the past few years. We have fallen in with the Black Hats at many events and have thoroughly enjoyed doing so. The Army of the Wabash was formed last year composed mostly of Indiana units. We know and have worked with many of its units and commanders. Another option is

the Cumberland Guard now commanded by our good friend Colonel Rob Van of the 49th Indiana. At the 2013 Jackson Civil War Muster the Great Lakes Battalion extended a formal invitation for the 7th Michigan to join their organization. The GLB is composed of several Michigan units all of whom we have served alongside over the past few decades (4th Michigan, Co. A, 14th Michigan, 16th Michigan, Co. D, 102th USCT, 114th Pennsylvania, 1st US (Berdan's) Sharpshooters, Co. B, and USS Michigan Marine Guard.). After discussion, it was decided the 7th Michigan Military would recommend at the Club general meeting that we join the Great Lakes Battalion.

#### Generic Impressions – Rifles

The possibility of purchasing a Lorenze style 3-banded musket was reviewed. New ones are currently more affordable than Enfields or Springfields by a couple of hundred dollars. We discussed whether we should get a Lorenze to have on hand to sell if someone needs a rifle at a reasonable price. There are apparently no issues with stacking arms if there is a mix of all three types of muskets. Any decision to purchase was put on hold since there are none available right now anyway.




The following information, along with the photo at right, was submitted by Steve Church:

"A co-worker of mine (and Tom Edward's) happened to mention that she had an ancestor in the 7th Michigan. Hopefully you can use the photo she provided in the newsletter. The following is some other information she wrote about him (info in parentheses is my addition):

Nathaniel Finch Clemence came to Michigan in 1859 after living in New York and Ohio and settled in the Galesburg area. He was a bookkeeper when he enlisted in 1861 at Galesburg. He served in Company I, was wounded at White Oak Swamp, Va. and discharged due to disability in December 1862. After discharge he traveled with a party west, possibly to the Dakota Territory, for an extended period of time. He kept journals during this time. He married Adelia in January 1865. In 1866 they were on a 40 acre farm on the "townline". In 1877 they moved to Dowling (Eaton County south of Hastings). He died January 29, 1896 and is buried in the Dowling Cemetery. The farm house still stands in Dowling.

His brother Edward also served in Company I, 7th Michigan Inf. His brother Frank was living in Assyria when he enlisted with the 4th Michigan Cav."



Editor's Note: The Assyria mentioned is, of course, not in the Middle East, but rather in Barry County, MI.

Notice that on the lower left comer of the photo, the name of the photographer can be seen. It is "Heath." The photographer's name was George Heath, his place of business, Hastings, MI. 7th MI club member Mark Heath is a descendant of this man, a distant cousin, two or three times removed.

# Jackson Report: Special Impressions Area

This year's Special Impressions Area was a huge success in terms of numbers, with 32 people in "The Village," along with the Emerald Peacock and the Medical Tent bringing the participation level up to over 50. The usual group of trades people and interesting characters, as well as some new ones, took part in "Jacksonburg 1863." Our Mayor and barber, Don Everett, did his part of keeping order in the Village and not letting those beards grow too long.

Trades people included the following: tinsmith; gunsmith; 1860's beauty tips; two dressmakers; a candlemaker; woodwright; stage stop; and post office.

First person impressions of Generals Robert E. Lee, Ulysses S. Grant; George E. Pickett, Henry Heth, William Fitzhugh "Rooney" Lee, and others were very well received. President Abraham Lincoln, and Confederate President Jefferson Davis presented rousing speeches. Quaker abolitionist Laura Havilland of Lenewee County was in attendance.

A mourning impression and funeral was presented by our own 7<sup>th</sup> MI civilians, with a special guest appearance by "Sheldon Cooper and Lulu." The mourning tent and coffin seemed to be our most popular display. These portrayals along with the medical scenario and Emerald Peacock at the edge of the battlefield proved very popular with spectators.


# Appreciation Dinner
