## RE: John W. Steadman, Pvt. 7<sup>th</sup> Michigan Inf.

Regarding Cyndi Carlson's Facebook post that was printed in last month's newsletter, asking for information regarding John W. Steadman, Don Everett replied with this entry from the *Regimental Brown Book*:

**"Steadman, John,** Burr Oak. Enlisted in company K, Seventh Infantry, Feb.17,1864, at Burr Oak, for 3 years, age 25. Mustered Feb.26,1864. Joined regiment at Stevensburg, Va., March 1,1864. Killed in action at Meadow Run Va., May 31, 1864. Buried in National Cemetery at Yorktown, Va. Grave No. 43."

Don added: Note that the date of death does not match the date on his grave marker. That is because the date in the brown book is from military records and shows the date he first showed up on the death list.


